

<p style="text-align: center;">Chapter 11</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Joint Arrangements</p>

11.1. Arrangements to promote well being

The council, or the Cabinet in order to promote the economic, social or environmental well-being of its area, may:

- 11.1.1. enter into arrangements or agreements with any person or body;
- 11.1.2. co-operate with, or facilitate or co-ordinate the activities of, any person or body;
and
- 11.1.3. exercise on behalf of that person or body any functions of that person or body.

11.2. Joint arrangements

- 11.2.1. The Council or Cabinet may set up joint arrangements with another council or councils to exercise its functions.
- 11.2.2. Details of any joint arrangements including any delegations to joint committees will be found in the council's scheme of delegations in Part 2 of this Constitution.

11.3. Delegation to and from other local authorities

- 11.3.1. The council may delegate functions to another local authority or the Cabinet of another local authority.
- 11.3.2. The Cabinet may delegate Cabinet functions to another local authority or the Cabinet of another local authority.
- 11.3.3. The decision whether or not to accept such a delegation from another local authority shall be reserved to the City council.

11.4. Contracting out

The council or Cabinet (as applicable) may contract out to another body or organisation functions which may be exercised by an officer and which are subject to an order under section 70 of the Deregulation and Contracting Out Act 1994, or under contracting arrangements where the contractor acts as the council's agent under usual contracting principles, provided there is no delegation of the council's discretionary decision making.
