ELKSTONE ROAD TRAFFIC CALMING SCHEME**

20 November 2017: Notice is hereby given that Portsmouth City Council proposes to install traffic calming measures in accordance with The Highways (Traffic Calming) Regulations 1999 and The Highways (Road Humps) Regulations 1999, as follows:

**INSTALLATION OF TRIPLE SET SPEED CUSHIONS (3 CUSHIONS/HUMPS IN A ROW)**

**1. Elkstone Road**

- a) Outside No.1 and the side of Nos.10/18 Hempsted Road
- b) Outside No.10 and No.17
- c) Outside No.26 and No.29
- d) Alongside No.2 Camcross Close and the rear of No.63 Winchcombe Road
- e) Outside No.56 and No.67

**COUNCIL'S REASONS FOR THE ORDER**

To improve the layout of Elkstone Road and reduce the speed of traffic travelling through the area from its junction with Leominster Road to its junction with Allaway Avenue, by implementing traffic calming measures.

Elkstone Road is subject to a 20mph speed limit, but unfortunately has a high level of non-compliance (58%). This is partly due to the road being long and straight with good visibility, enabling faster vehicle speeds. The proposed traffic calming features, along with new road markings and signage to highlight the speed limit, aim to improve road safety in the area.
