

**THE PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL (D-DAY MUSEUM, CLARENCE ESPLANADE)
(AMENDMENTS TO WAITING RESTRICTIONS AND PARKING PLACES) (NO.20) ORDER 2020**

21 January 2020: Notice is hereby given that Portsmouth City Council proposes to make the above Order under sections 1 – 4, 32, 35, 36, 45 and 46 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ('the 1984 Act'), as amended, the Traffic Management Act 2004, the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007, and of all other enabling powers and in accordance with parts III and IV of schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, to facilitate the relocation of the entrance to the D-Day museum's car park.

Former Car Park Entrance

A) CHANGE FROM DOUBLE YELLOW LINES TO DISABLED BAY

i) Clarence Esplanade

South side, extend the disabled parking bay westwards by 5.25m (parallel)

B) CHANGE FROM DISABLED BAY AND DOUBLE YELLOW LINES TO PAY & DISPLAY

i) Clarence Esplanade

South side, extend the pay & display bay eastwards by 53m in front of the current entrance

New Car Park Entrance (Approx. 100 metres to the west of former)

A) CHANGE FROM PAY & DISPLAY TO DISABLED PARKING BAY

i) Clarence Esplanade

South side, replace pay & display bay for 6 vehicles with disabled parking bay for 4 vehicles (15m length, echelon) west of new car park entrance

B) CHANGE FROM PAY & DISPLAY TO DOUBLE YELLOW LINES

i) Clarence Esplanade

South side, a 26m length west and a 45m length east of the new car park entrance (extended length east of the new entrance to accommodate new pedestrian crossing point)

This results in improved pedestrian crossing facilities, and an overall loss of 7 parking spaces.
