

**THE PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL (SOUTH PARADE) (LOADING AMENDMENT)
(NO.88) ORDER 2017**

Notice is hereby given that Portsmouth City Council on 13 September 2017 made the above Order under sections 1-4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order comes into operation on 27 September 2017 and the effect will be as follows:

A) REMOVAL OF POLICE BAY (ADJACENT LOADING BAY ADVERTISED UNDER TRO 56/2017 NOT TO BE EXTENDED IN ITS PLACE)

1. South Parade

South side, the 15m length west of South Parade Pier

B) EXTENSION TO WHITE HATCHINGS AND CYCLE LANE MARKINGS

1. South Parade

South side, a 15m length in place of the former 'Police' bay west of South Parade Pier

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 13 September 2017 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
