

THE PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL (ARMORY LANE, BEEHIVE WALK AND GRAYS COURT) (DERESTRICTION AND 20MPH SPEED LIMIT) (NO.29) ORDER 2021

1 March 2021: Notice is hereby given that the Portsmouth City Council ("the Council") proposes to make the above Order under Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), as amended, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police for Hampshire in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act. The effect would be as follows:

A) DERESTRICTION AND 20MPH SPEED LIMIT

1. Armory Lane

For the entire length of the public highway (excludes the privately-owned sections)

2. Beehive Walk

For the entire length of the public highway (excludes the privately-owned sections)

3. Grays Court

For the entire length of the public highway (excludes the privately-owned sections)

CITY COUNCIL'S REASONS FOR THE ORDER

- These no-through roads, along with other cul-de-sacs in the city, were not part of the original citywide 20mph scheme in 2006-2008; they have been included following concerns from residents about the speed of traffic entering the residential area from St George's Road.
- 20mph is an appropriate speed for the type and nature of these roads and seeks to improve road safety for pedestrians and cyclists; children and other vulnerable road users in particular;
- For avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of such danger arising.
