


# THE PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL (FAWCETT ROAD) (AMENDMENTS TO WAITING RESTRICTIONS) (NO. 43) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2021

30 April 2021: The Portsmouth City Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ('the Act'), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:

## A) REDUCE LIMITED TIME PARKING BAY TO ACCOMMODATE FOOTWAY EXTENSION

### 1. Fawcett Road

East side, a 5m length outside No.77 Fawcett Road (Baffled Coffee shop)



### CITY COUNCIL'S REASONS FOR MAKING THE ORDER

- The footway buildout/extension will replace 1 parking space and aims to prioritise pedestrians by extending footway space, creating a "parklet" to encourage regeneration of the locality and improve the street scene;
- Contributes to making Portsmouth city cleaner, safer and greener;
- For any of the purposes specified in s.87(1)(a-c) of the Environment Act 1995 (air quality).

The Experimental Traffic Order could be in operation for up to 18 months from **10 May 2021**.

In due course, the City Council will consider whether or not to make the provisions of this Order permanent, subject to assessment of the trial. If the proposals require a decision to be made at a public meeting, representations are anonymised in accordance with data protection law and included in the published report. Please see the

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may do so within 6 weeks from 30 April 2021 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
