

THE PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS) (DISABLED PERSONS' PARKING PLACES AND AMENDMENTS) (NO. 18) ORDER 2022

The Portsmouth City Council (hereinafter referred to as "the council"), in exercise of the powers under Sections 32, 35, and 36 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act"), as amended, the Traffic Management Act 2004 ("the 2004 Act"), the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007 ("the 2007 Regulations"), of all other enabling powers, and in accordance with Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as The Portsmouth City Council (Various Roads) (Disabled Persons' Parking Places and Amendments) (No.18) Order 2022 and shall come into operation on 11 April 2022.

2. (1) In this Order:

"Disabled Person's Vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000

"Badges Regulations" means the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000

"Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in section 2 of the Disabled Person's (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

"Parking Permit" means a permit, issued by the Local Authority which allows the permit holder to park in one specific bay / parking place.

"Parking Place" and "Parking Bay" have the same meaning: the area for parking of disabled person's vehicles and indicated by markings on the surface of the road in accordance with "The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016"

"Penalty Charge" means an additional parking charge set by the Council under the provisions of Section 78 the 2004 Act and has the same meaning as Section 2 of Part 1 of the 2007 Regulations;

"Penalty Charge Notice" means a notice issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer in accordance with the provisions of Section 78 of the 2004 Act and Section 2 of Part 1 of the 2007 Regulations;

"Permitted Hours" means at any time and without time limit

"Relevant Position" means

- (a) A vehicle displays a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if it is displayed in the manner prescribed by regulation 12 of the Badges Regulations
- (b) A vehicle displays a parking permit in the relevant position if –
 - (i) the parking permit is exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle; or
 - (ii) where the vehicle does not have a dashboard or facia, the parking permit is exhibited in a conspicuous position of the vehicle.

- (2) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
3. The Orders specified in Schedule 1 to this Order are hereby varied as specified in that Schedule.
4. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any vehicle other than a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a Disabled Person's Badge or relevant parking permit to wait in the parking place as described in Schedule 2.
5. In relation to the parking places described in Schedule 2;
- (1) The class of vehicles permitted to use the authorised parking places are disabled persons vehicles which display in the relevant position a disabled persons badge or the relevant parking permit;
- (2) The position in which vehicles may wait shall be parallel or angled to the kerb within the marked parking bays;
- (3) The parking bay or place shall be a minimum of 5 metres in length.
6. (1) Any person authorised by the Council or a police constable in uniform may suspend the use of a Parking Place or any part thereof whenever he/she considers such suspension reasonably necessary.
- (2) On the suspension of the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article the person authorising or causing such suspension shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that Parking Place or that part thereof as the case may be a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that the waiting of vehicles is prohibited.
7. Nothing in Article 4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the road, lengths of road and sides of lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable:
- (a) A person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- (b) Goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
- (c) The vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:
- i) Building, industrial or demolition operations;
- ii) The removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- iii) The maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said side or length of road;
- iv) The laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said side or length of road of any sewer, or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line.
- (d) The vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

- (e) A vehicle of (and bearing a livery used by) a universal service provider within the meaning ascribed by the Postal Services Act 2000 to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets in the course of the provision of a universal postal service as defined in that Act;
 - (f) A vehicle to be used by a registered Medical Practitioner in the course of his professional duties;
 - (g) The vehicle to be used for Fire and Rescue, Ambulance or Police purposes.
8. If a vehicle is left without complying with any of the requirements of this Order then a contravention will have occurred and a Penalty Charge shall be payable. A Penalty Charge Notice may then be issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer, in accordance with the requirements of the 2004 Act.
9. The requirements, prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any requirement, prohibition or restriction imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the 1984 Act, or by any other enactment.
10. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
