

THE PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL (ONE-WAY STREETS) (NO.58) ORDER 2022

28th March 2022: Notice is hereby given that the Portsmouth City Council proposes to make the above Order. The effect would be to introduce the following:

One Way except Cycles

1. **Maxwell Road**, travelling eastwards, between its junction with Winter and Landguard Road
2. **Landguard Road**, travelling eastwards, between its junction with Maxwell Road and Eastney Road
3. **Reginald Road**, travelling westwards, between its junction with Eastney Road and Hatfield Road
4. **Tredegar Road**, travelling westwards, between its junction with Hatfield Road and Winter Road

Note: This is a modification of an earlier notice advertised on 22nd March 2021. Point 2 of the proposal (Landguard Road) has been updated.
