

THE PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL (BRAMBLE ROAD & TALBOT ROAD) (ONE-WAY STREETS & WAITING RESTRICTIONS) (EXPERIMENTAL) ORDER 2024

1. Portsmouth City Council hereby gives Notice that on the 9 February 2024 it made the above Experimental Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into effect on 23 February 2024.

The effect of the Order will be to:

- a. Introduce one way working (except cycles, which may travel in either direction) on the following roads:
 - i. **Bramble Road**, *eastwards* between its junction with Fawcett Road and its junction with Talbot Road;
 - ii. **Talbot Road**, *southwards* between its junction with Bramble Road and its junction with Fawcett Road; and
 - iii. **Talbot Road**, *northwards* between its junction with Bramble Road and its junction with Jessie Road
 - b. To introduce "No waiting at any time" (double yellow line) restrictions on **Talbot Road** *west side* from 2 metres north of its junction with Fawcett Road northwards for 10 metres (in place of parking for MC zone permit holders, to enable installation of a planter and cycle storage facility).
2.  3. If the provisions of the Order continue in operation for a period of at least six months, the Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the experimental Order should be continued in force indefinitely by means of a permanent Order. Any person desiring to object to the making of an Order for the purpose of such indefinite continuation may, within six months of the experimental Order coming into operation, send a statement in writing of the objection and the grounds on which it is made to TROteam@portsmouthcc.gov.uk or by post to the Parking Team, Portsmouth City Council, Civic Offices, Portsmouth PO1 2NE, quoting ref TRO E005 2024.
 4. Under requirements of current access to information legislation, please note that all representations submitted in response to this Notice may be made available for public inspection. Full details of the Council's Data Protection privacy notice can be viewed on the website.
 5. The Order provides for the Assistant Director for Transport or any person authorised by them to modify or suspend the Order or any provision of it, if it appears to them or that person essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Order runs.

6. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the 1984 Act, or that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order is made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
