

**THE PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS)
(WAITING RESTRICTIONS) (PROPOSED INSTALLATION OF BICYCLE
HANGARS) (No.58) ORDER 2024**

1. Notice is hereby given that the Portsmouth City Council proposes to make the above Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The effect of the Order would be to introduce "No Waiting at Any Time" restrictions in the following roads, in order to accommodate cycle storage hangars 3 metres long:

Adair Road, *west side*, outside Eastney Methodist Church (in place of parking for MG Zone permit holders); **Kimberley Road**, *east side* outside no 41 (in place of parking for MG Zone permit holders); **Bertie Road**, *west side* outside No 14; **Exmouth Road** *east side* outside the rear of No 2 Collingwood Road (in place of parking for MD Zone permit holders); **Fordingbridge Road**, *north-east side* at the side of No 53 Henderson Road (in place of parking for MH Zone permit holders).

3. Persons wishing to object to or make other representations with regard to these proposals must do so in writing, stating the grounds on which they are made. Representations must be sent to TROteam@portsmouthcc.gov.uk or by post to TRO team, Portsmouth City Council, Civic Offices, Portsmouth PO1 2NE, quoting ref TRO P058/24 within 21 days of the date of this Notice (i.e. by **13 December 2024**) stating the grounds for the objection.
