(DISABLED PERSONS' PARKING PLACES AND AMENDMENTS) (P055-24) ORDER 2024

Notice is hereby given that the Portsmouth City Council on 13 December 2024 made the above Order. The Order comes into operation on 17 December 2024, to effect:

A) DISABLED PERSONS' PARKING BAYS (MINIMUM 5-METRE LENGTH)

Only vehicles displaying a Blue Badge or relevant permit issued by the Council may park at these locations:
