

THE PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL (RESIDENTS' PARKING PLACES) (RAILWAY VIEW AREA) ORDER 2024

The Portsmouth City Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”), in exercise of the powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, 35, 36, 45, 46, 51, 52, 53 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the 1984 Act”), of all other enabling powers, and in accordance with Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby makes the following Order:

CITATION AND COMMENCEMENT

1. This Order may be cited as The Portsmouth City Council (Residents' Parking Places) (Railway View Area) Order 2024 and shall come into operation on the 24 March 2025.

GENERAL

2. Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to an Article or Section or Part or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Section or Part or Schedule bearing that number or letter in this Order.
3. The requirements, prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any requirement, prohibition or restriction imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the 1984 Act, or by any other enactment.
4. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

INTERPRETATION

5. In this Order
 - (I) "Principal Order" means The Portsmouth City Council (Consolidation) (On-Street Parking Places and Restrictions on Waiting and Loading) (No.1) Order 2022, as amended
 - (II) The requirements, prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any requirement, prohibition or restriction imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the 1984 Act, or by any other enactment.
 - (III) the following expressions shall have the respective meanings assigned to them;

“Business” means a business which is registered for the purpose of paying non-domestic rates and is at a postal address that is in any road or part of a road or zone specified in Schedule 5 to this Order;

“Council” means Portsmouth City Council;

“Civil Enforcement Officer” means any person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise and control parking in the City of Portsmouth and to carry out such other functions as may be conferred by or under any enactment;

“Disabled Person’s Badge” has the same meaning as in Section 2 of The Disabled Persons’ (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

"Disabled Person's Vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000;

"goods" means goods of any kind, whether aminate or inanimate and includes postal packets of any description; and "delivering" and "collecting" in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

"Motorcycle" has the same meaning as in Section 136(4) of the 1984 Act;

motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 136(1) of the 1984 Act;

"Owner", has the same meaning as in Section 92 of the Traffic Management Act 2004

"parking place" means any area on a highway designated as such by this Order

"Parking space" means any area of a Parking Place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle and which is indicated by markings on the surface of the Parking Place;

"Parking Disc" means a disc issued by the Council, approximately 125 millimetres in diameter or square, coloured blue, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins or other parking device issued by the Council;

"Parking Place" means that part of the highway designated by this Order in Schedules 3 and 4 to be used as a place to park a vehicle;

"parking space" means a space in a parking place referred to in Schedule 3 which is provided for the leaving of vehicles;

"Parking Zone" means those Residents' Parking Places named in Schedules 3 and 4;

"Penalty Charge" means an additional parking charge set by the Council under the provisions of Section 78 the 2004 Act

"Penalty Charge Notice" means a notice issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer in accordance with the provisions of Section 78 of the 2004 Act

"Permit" means a permit authorised and issued, in physical or electronic format, by the Council for use in the Parking Zone under the provisions of or relating to this Order;

"Permit Holder" means a person or organisation to whom or to which a Permit has been issued;

"Permitted hours" means the period of time during which a Parking Place is open or available for the leaving of vehicles in accordance with this Order;

"Relevant Position" means

- (a) In the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, any parking ticket, Parking Disc, Permit, Disabled Person's Badge or other parking device is:
 - (i) exhibited on the near-side of the vehicle on the inside of the front windscreen; or
 - (ii) in a prominent place on the near-side of the vehicle immediately behind the front windscreen;
- and
- (iii) with all particulars legible from outside the front of the vehicle.

- (b) In the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, that any parking ticket(s), Parking Disc, Permit, Disabled person's badge or other parking device is/are:
 - (i) exhibited in a prominent and conspicuous place on the front, near-side of the vehicle; and
 - (ii) with all particulars legible from the front of the vehicle.

"Resident" means a person whose main place of residence is at a postal address that is in any road or part of a road or zone specified in Schedule 5 to this Order;

DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACES

- 6. Each of the lengths of road identified in columns 1, 2 and 3 of Schedule 3 having a width as indicated by the road markings, or in the case of signed only areas a width that extends from the centre of the carriageway to the back of the highway, are designated as a parking place.
- 7. The limits of each parking place and the limits of each parking space, shall be indicated on the highway by traffic signs of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised under Section 64 of the 1984 Act

MANNER OF STANDING IN A PARKING PLACE

- 8. A vehicle left in a parking place must be parked wholly within the limits of the parking place.
- 9. Unless prior consent from the Council is obtained, no vehicle must be left in a parking place used in connection with the sale of any goods or services, except where goods are being delivered to or collected from any premises in the area.
- 10. No vehicle left in a parking place shall be left in a position which prevents access to any premises or obstructs other road users.

SUSPENSION OF PARKING PLACES

- 11. The Council or any person so authorised by the Council may suspend use of a parking place or part of a parking place as considered necessary.
- 12. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in a parking place which has been suspended.

PERMIT PARKING OR TIME-LIMITED PARKING PLACES

- 13. No vehicle shall be left in a parking place to which a permit parking with time-limited parking restriction applies, during the restricted hours specified in Column 4 of Schedule 3 to this Order, for longer than the maximum stay as specified in Column 5, Schedule 3 to this Order, unless a valid Permit has been issued in respect of that vehicle.
- 14. No Vehicle left in a parking place to which a Permit parking with a time-limited parking restriction applies, during the restricted hours shall return to any parking place in the

same street within the no return period, as specified in Column 6, Schedule 3 to this Order, unless a valid Permit has been issued in respect of that vehicle.

APPLICATION FOR AND ISSUE OF PERMITS FOR THE USE OF PARKING PLACES

15. An application for a Permit must be made in a manner specified by the Council.
16. The Council may require an applicant to produce such evidence as considered necessary to verify any information submitted.
17. A Permit may only be issued by the Council to an applicant who meets the eligibility criteria specified in column 6 of Schedule 6.
18. The charge for issuing a Permit shall be as specified in Column 2, Column 3 and Column 4 of Schedule 6.
19. A duplicate of a Permit may be issued by the Council if the original Permit has been lost, stolen or becomes mutilated, defaced, faded, discoloured or otherwise illegible.
20. An amendment permit may be issued by the Council by virtue of the owner changing his vehicle.
21. An amendment or duplicate Permit will only be issued on surrender of the original Permit.
22. The charge for issuing a duplicate or amendment Permit shall be £10.
23. The Council reserves the right to vary the policy, charges and terms for the issue of a Permit as it considers appropriate and may provide written notice of any such variation as it considers appropriate.
24. Notwithstanding the preceding Articles, the issuing of Permits is at the absolute discretion of the Council.

VALIDITY OF PERMITS

25. A Permit shall not be valid when used in contravention of the conditions of use specified in column 7 of Schedule 6 , or in contravention of any other terms or conditions of use set out by the Council.
26. A Permit shall only be valid for use in the Permit Parking Zone
27. A Permit shall permanently cease to be valid in the following circumstances:
 - a) After the expiry date specified on it
 - b) The Permit holder ceases to be eligible.
 - c) The withdrawal of the Permit by the Council
 - d) The issue of a duplicate or amendment Permit by the Council.
 - e) The Council believes the Permit is being used in a dishonest or fraudulent manner, or intentionally used in contravention of the conditions of use set out by the Council.

WITHDRAWAL AND SURRENDER OF PERMITS

28. A Permit holder may surrender the Permit to the Council at any time.
29. A Permit holder must surrender a Permit to the Council in the circumstances specified in Article 27.
30. The Council may serve notice to withdraw a Permit; on receipt of this notice the Permit holder shall surrender the Permit within 48 hours.
31. The notice specified in Article 30 shall be served to the Permit holder at the address or email address given on their application or at any other address believed to be the Permit holder's residence or place of business.

MISHANDLING OF PARKING DOCUMENTS

32. The Parking Team Manager or any employee of the Council working on his behalf, and all Civil Enforcement Officers are authorised to act in accordance with Section 116 of the 1984 Act.

EXEMPTION

33. Nothing in this Order shall apply to:
 - a) Anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform, or a Civil Enforcement Officer;
 - b) vehicle being used for fire and rescue (within the meaning of the Fire and Rescue Services Act 2004), ambulance (including providing a response to an emergency at the request of an NHS ambulance service), bomb or explosive disposal, special forces, police or National Crime Agency purposes and the observance of a provision of this Order would be likely to hinder the use of that vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used;
 - c) A vehicle being used in connection with any building, industrial or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction of traffic, the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the road, the laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer, or of any main, pipe or apparatus, for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus and the observance of a provision of this Order would be likely to hinder the use of that vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used
 - d) A vehicle being used by or on behalf of the Council or water authority in pursuance of a statutory power or duty and the observance of a provision of this Order would be likely to hinder the use of that vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used;
 - e) A vehicle being used by or on behalf of a Statutory Undertaker in pursuance of a statutory power or duty and the observance of a provision of this Order would be likely to hinder the use of that vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used;
 - f) To allow the opening or closing of a gate or barrier at an entrance to which the vehicle requires access, or has just exited from; or
 - g) A Disabled Persons Vehicle displaying a Disabled Persons Badge.

CONTRAVENTION

34. If a vehicle is left in a parking place at any time during the permitted hours without complying with the provisions of this Order, then a contravention shall be deemed to have occurred, and a penalty charge shall be payable.

REMOVAL OF VEHICLES

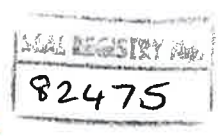
35. Where a vehicle is left in a parking place without complying with the provisions of this Order, the vehicle may be removed or caused to be removed from that parking place as provided by the Regulations made under section 99 of the 1984 Act.
36. Any person removing or arranging a vehicle to be removed under Article 31 must make such arrangements as reasonably necessary for the safe custody of that vehicle.

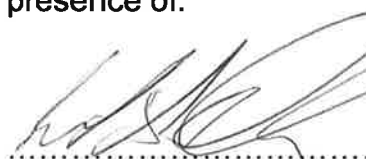
AMENDMENTS

497. GLIDDEN CLOSE

(a) The west side from its junction with Highfield Road in a northerly direction for a distance of 13 metres

(b) The southeast side from a point 4 metres north of the projected north side of Highfield Road in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 8 metres

592. HIGHFIELD ROAD

(a) Both sides from its junction with Milford Road in an easterly direction for a distance of 3 metres

(b) The south side from a point 60 metres east of its junction with Milford Road in an easterly and southerly direction for a distance of 29 metres

(c) The north side from its junction with Glidden Close in a westerly direction for a distance of 20 metres

820. MILFORD ROAD

(a) The west side from its junction with Canal Walk in a northerly direction for a distance of 14 metres

(b) The east side from a point 3 metres north of its junction with Highfield Road to a point 4 metres south of that junction

1012. RAILWAY VIEW

(a) The north side;

(i) from a point 2 metres west of its junction with Cottage View to a point 5 metres east of that junction

(ii) from its junction with Claxton Street in a westerly direction for a distance of 7 metres

(iii) from its junction with Upper Arundel Street to a point 18 metres west of its junction with Claxton Street

(b) The south side from a point opposite the west side of Cottage View in an easterly direction for a distance of 19 metres

SCHEDULE 2

- (a) Both sides
 - (i) from the north-western kerbline of Railway View north-westwards for 2.5 metres

497. GLIDDEN CLOSE

- (a) The west and north side,
 - (i) from the north-western kerbline of Highfield Road to a point 5 metres east of the western property boundary wall of Nos 10-18 Glidden Close
- (b) south-east side
 - (i) from a point 3.5 metres north-east of the north-western kerbline of Highfield Road to the western boundary wall of Nos 25-32 Glidden Close
- (c) both sides
 - (i) from a point 31 metres east of the western property boundary wall of Nos 10-18 Glidden Close north-eastwards to its north-eastern closed end

- (d) The north side

- (i) from its junction with Glidden Close in a westerly direction to a point 54 metres north-east of the north-eastern kerblines of Milford Road

820. MILFORD ROAD

(a) The west side

- (i) from the south-western kerblines of Canal Walk in a north-westerly direction to the south-eastern boundary of No 1 Milford Road
- (ii) from its north-western closed end south-eastwards to a point 1 metre north-west of the boundary of Nos 27 and 29 Milford Road

(b) The east side

- (i) from a point 6 metres north-west of the north-western kerblines of Highfield Road to a point 6 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerblines of Highfield Road
- (ii) from its north-western closed end south-eastwards to a point 17.5 metres north-west of the north-western kerblines of Highfield Road

(c) north-western closed end

- (i) for its entire length

1012. RAILWAY VIEW

(a) The north side;

- (i) from a point 2 metres west of its junction with Cottage View to a point 5 metres east of that junction
- (ii) from a point 9.5 metres west of the western kerblines of Claxton Street to a point 7 metres east of the eastern kerblines of Claxton Street
- (iii) from its junction with Bridport Street to a point 19.5 metres west of the western kerblines of Claxton Street

(b) The south side

- (i) from a point opposite the west side of Cottage View in an easterly direction for a distance of 19 metres
- (ii) from its junction with Bridport Street to a point 6.5 metres east of the north-eastern kerblines of Canal Walk
