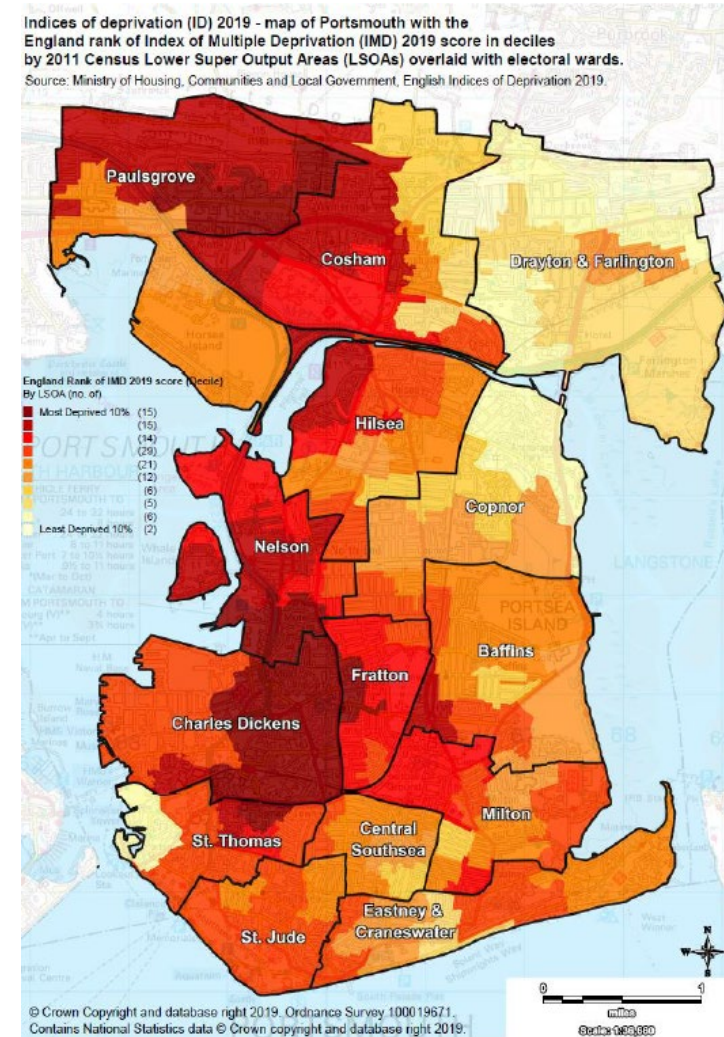

Reduce our carbon emissions through:

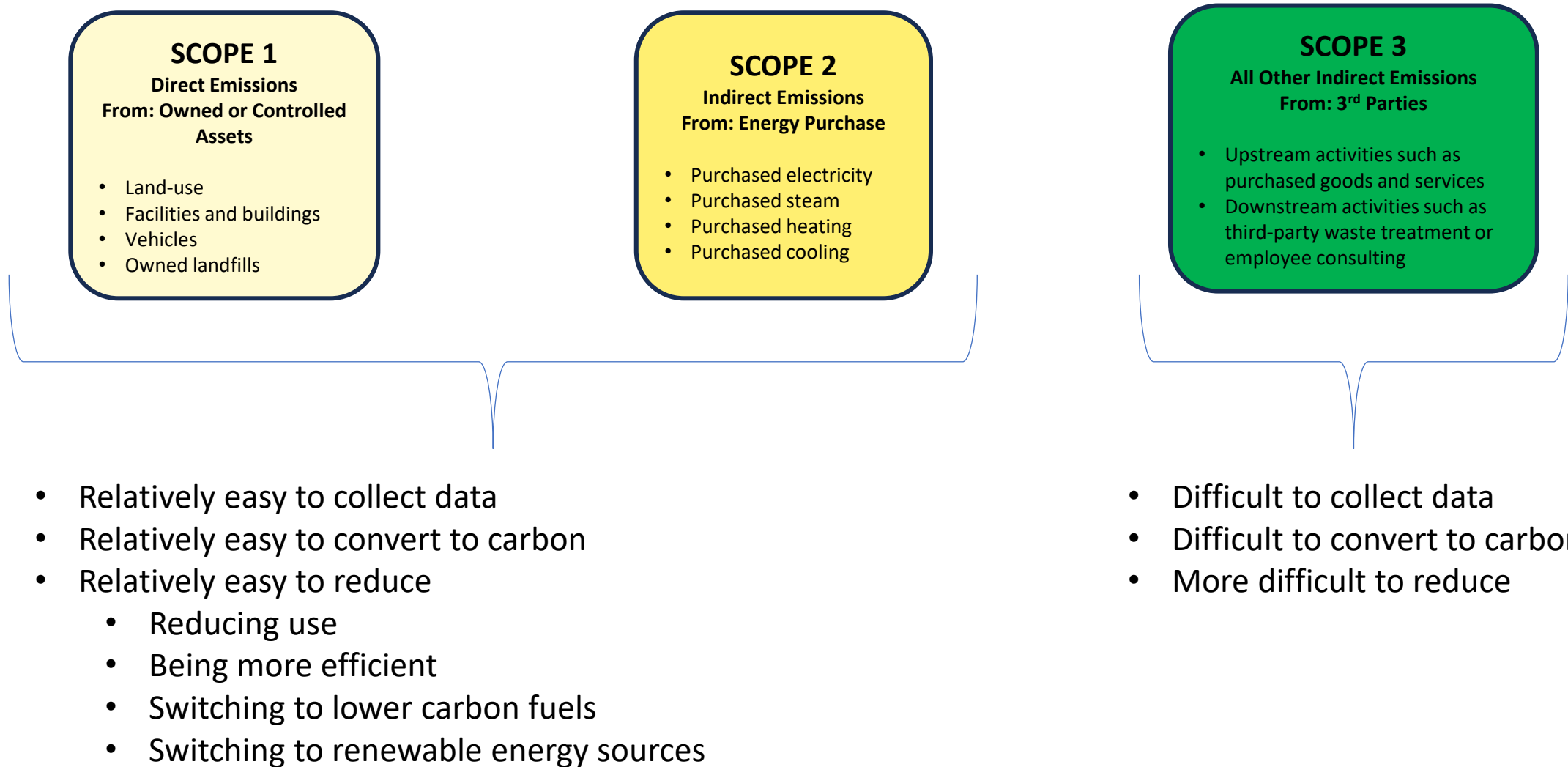
- Building a robust understanding of our emissions profile
- Reduce our emissions to net zero by 2030



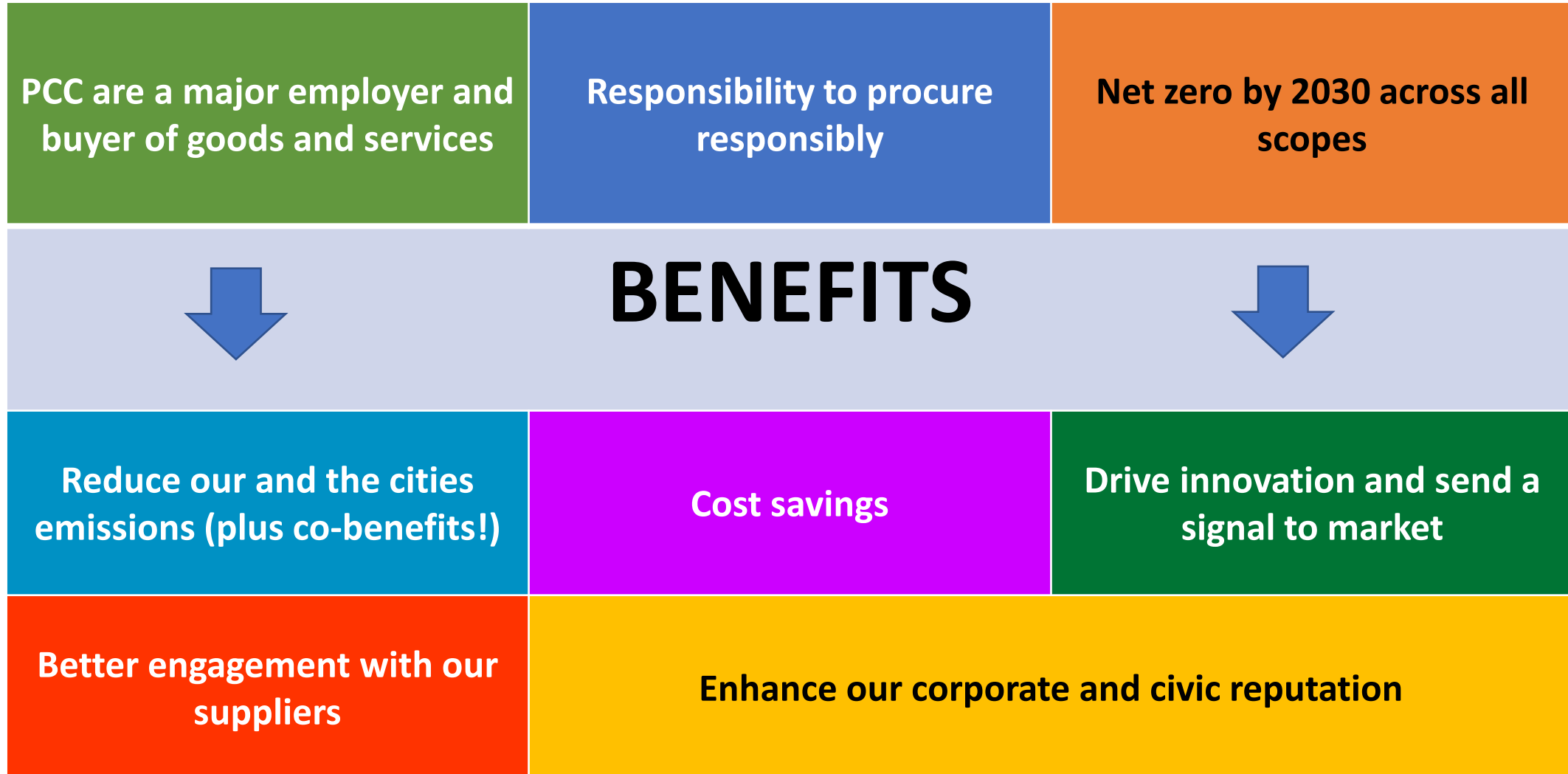
Increase our resilience to changing climates through:

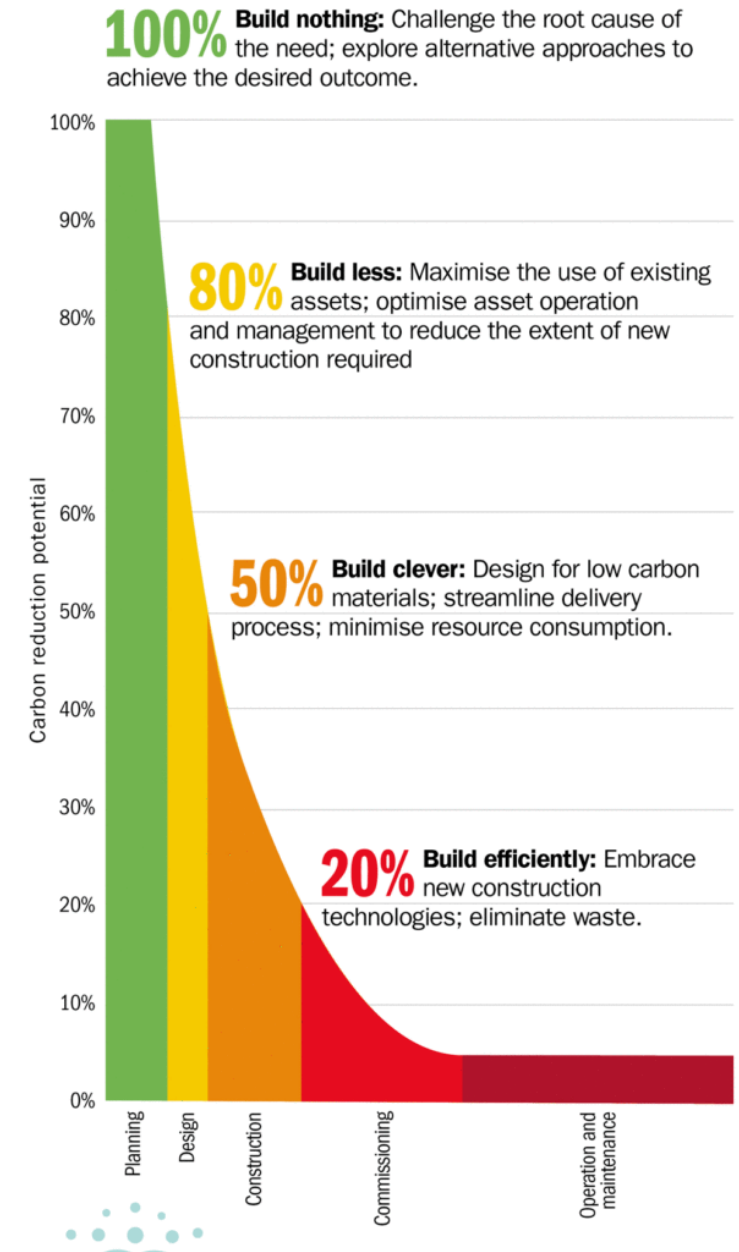

Social value – The Portsmouth Way

Since formalising our Social Value Policy in March 2022 we have supported:

100 more local jobs

£59,000 equipment for voluntary organisations

7,000 hours of volunteering

2,500 tonnes of waste recycled rather than to landfill

Social Value across the city

So much to celebrate

- We Shine Portsmouth (Portsmouth Creates)
- We Create Markets (Portsmouth Creates)
- Portsmouth Diverse City Trail (Seekers)
- Resident consultations that are shaping peoples communities
- Covid Volunteers from the community and businesses
- Digital inclusion work to support young people and adults

Social Value across the city

- Creation of 108 local jobs and a further 43 sub-local (wider PO postcode) jobs
- Target of recruiting for over 50 of the new positions from disadvantaged groups - veterans, care leavers, BAME, ex-offenders, etc.
- 800 hours of career mentoring
- 1,000 hours of school and colleges engagement - careers talks, literacy support, curriculum support, etc.
- Creation of 18 new apprenticeship provisions
- 223 weeks of work placements, 119 of which are paid work placements
- £40M of spend via local supply chains
- £59,000 worth of equipment for VCSE organisations
- Over 7,000 hours of voluntary support for VCSE organisations
- 99% of directly employed and sub-contract workers paid at least current Real Living Wage level
- Target to save over 3,000 tonnes of CO2 emissions
- Over 80% of vehicle fleet to meet low emission Euro 6 standards or above
- Over 2,500 tonnes of waste to be diverted from landfill
