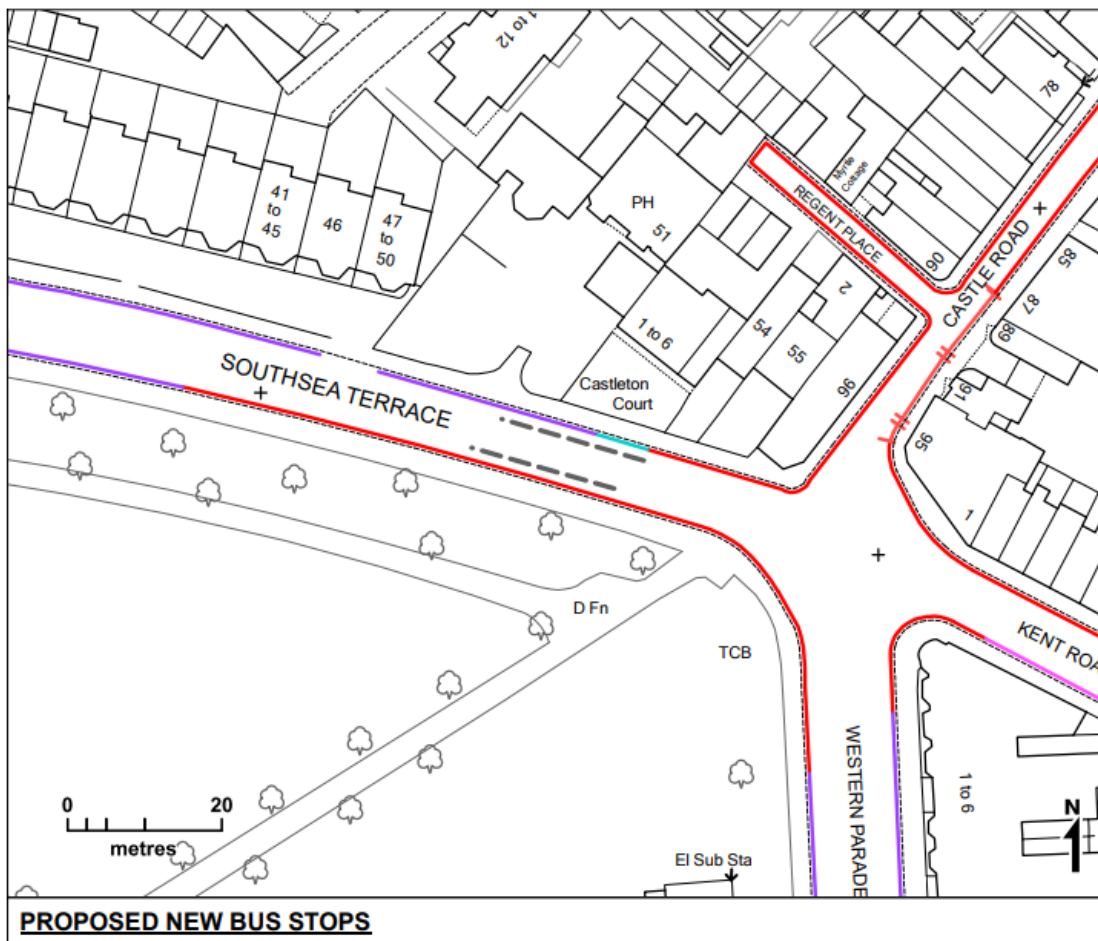


PUBLIC NOTICE

PROPOSED NEW BUS STOPS, SOUTHSEA TERRACE

1. Notice is hereby given that the Portsmouth City Council proposes to introduce new bus stop clearways (No stopping at any time except buses) in Southsea in the following locations:
 - a) **Southsea Terrace north side** from the pedestrian access to the Brewhouse & Kitchen PH to the boundary of Castleton Court and No 54 (in place of a Disabled Person's Parking bay, and Pay & Display parking) ; and
 - b) **Southsea Terrace south side** from opposite the pedestrian access to the Brewhouse & Kitchen PH to opposite the access to Castleton Court (in place of "no waiting at any time" restrictions).

2. The reason for the proposal is to facilitate passenger access to the extended No 18 bus service which will now run between Southsea shops and Clarence Pier via Kent Road.
