THE PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL (ST. NICHOLAS STREET AREA & HEYWARD ROAD)(SCHOOL STREETS) ORDER 2024

The Portsmouth City Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council"), in exercise of its powers under Sections 9 & 10 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the same Act hereby makes the following Order:

CITATION

1. This Order may be cited as **The Portsmouth City Council (St. Nicholas Street Area & Heyward Road) (School Streets) Order 2024** and shall come into operation on the **30 July 2025**

INTERPRETATION

2. In this Order:

Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order:

"The 1984 Act" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended;

"The 2016 Regulations" means the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016, as amended;

"Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in Section 2 of The Disabled Persons' (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

"Motability scooter" means a vehicle specifically designed to assist users with a disability with a maximum speed of 8mph and a maximum width of 0.85 metres. Scooters will have a maximum unladen weight of 150kg or 200kg if medical equipment is required;

"Motor Vehicle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on the roads as defined in Section 185 of the Road Traffic Act 1988;

"Pedal cycle" means a unicycle, bicycle tricycle or cycle not having four or more wheels not being in any case mechanically propelled unless it is an electrically assisted pedal cycle of such class as it is to be treated as not being a motor vehicle for the purposes of the 1984 Act;

"Permit" means a permit issued in accordance with the Portsmouth City Council terms and conditions.

"Private Hire Vehicle" means a licensed vehicle constructed or adapted to seat fewer than nine passengers, other than a hackney carriage or public service vehicle, which is provided for hire with the services of a driver for the purpose of carrying passengers

"School transportation" means the procedure by the Board of Education by which a student is conveyed, at public expense, by publicly owned equipment or by contract to or from residence to or from the school in which s/he is enrolled.

"Taxi" has the same meaning as "Hackney Carriage" as defined in Section 37 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847;

"Traffic Sign" means a sign prescribed or authorised under the 2016 Regulations;

"Vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the 1984 Act;

3. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act, or by or under any other enactment.

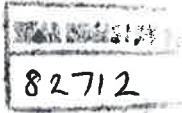
PROHIBITED MOVEMENTS

4. Save as provided in Article 4, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the roads specified in Column 1 of the Schedule between the extents of Column 2 during the restricted hours specified in Columns 3 and 4.
5. Nothing in Article 3 shall apply to:
 - (a) Any mechanical road cleansing vehicle;
 - (b) A vehicle to be used for police, fire and rescue, ambulance, coastguard for service purposes;
 - (c) An vehicle being used in connection with any of the following operations to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to the said length of road, namely:-
 - i) building or demolition; or
 - ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic; or

- iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of those lengths of road; or
 - iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said length of road, of any sewer, or any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas or electricity, or any telegraphic line; or
 - v) pedal cycle: or
 - vi) Motability scooter; or
 - vii) a vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge, being used by the person it has been issued to; or
 - viii) a private hire vehicle or taxi delivering or collecting residents; or
 - ix) a permit holder; or
 - x) a vehicle being used for School Transportation.
- (d) Any vehicle, which is a universal service provider for the collection or delivery of postal packets in the course of a universal postal service;
- (e) Any vehicle being used for the collection and deliveries of monies, provided that vehicles referred to in this paragraph shall be only those security vehicles which have been specially made or adapted for that purpose; or
- (f) Any vehicle specifically authorised by the Council.
