

PROPOSED SPEED HUMP, CASTLE ROAD, ST. THOMAS

1. Notice is hereby given that Portsmouth City Council proposes to introduce road hump under the Highways Act 1980.
2. Castle Road is one of the oldest roads in Southsea, lined with one-of-a-kind shops and buildings, Castle Road is a unique heritage destination. To support the independent businesses and shops a raised carriageway is being proposed to introduce a safe and enhanced shared space with complementary greening.
3. The road hump would be in the form of a raised table across the full width of the carriageway and would be situated on Castle Road, St. Thomas as follows:

Location	Height	Length	Ramp length and gradient
Castle Road from its junction with Hambrook Street to its junction with Regent Place (junctions not included)	80mm	102 m	800mm, 1:10
