Families of Christian faith - are children, who practice their faith at churches who are members or participant observers of the World Council of Churches or the World Evangelical Alliance.

Families of other faith - means children who are members of a religious community that does not fall within the definition of 'other Christian denominations' above and which fall within the definition of a religion for the purposes of charity law. The Charities Act 2011 defines religion to include: A religion which involves belief in one God and a religion which involves a belief in more than one God, and a religion which does not involve belief in a God. Case law has identified certain characteristics which describe the meaning of religion for the purposes of charity law, which are characterised by a belief in a supreme being and an expression of belief in that supreme being through worship.
